Dear Parents and Carers



Centenary day, 18th September 2012 was very memorable for both children and staff. You may have heard that we had a visit from the 1912 Lord Clinton and Lady Alice Ewing (Mr John Beaumont and Mrs Judy Day) who were strong patrons of our school. Their presence at the assembly bought gravitas to the occasion not only were they wonderfully attired in their 1912 costumes but used superb acting skills to impress on us all of the solemnity of the occasion.

The formality of 1912 meant that lessons for the morning were very different from today and that children had to be unquestionably obedient and diligent in their endeavours. The role of the teacher was about control and instruction, the children were surprised about how strict and regimented school life might have been. KS2 boys

and girls were kept apart even at playtime and lunchtime. In the afternoon the children played 1912 games and those at KS2 had races known as treats, winners only received a sweet from Mr Mullins, the 1912 Headmaster. A picnic tea followed on the field. I particularly enjoyed my role as Headmaster and it has been difficult for me to adapt back to 2012. The cane was seen regularly over the day and I am pleased to report that there wasn't an occasion to use it.

I should like to thank everyone for making such a splendid effort with costume and providing a 1912 tea. The children looked splendid and this helped many of them to get into role.

This afternoon our **Year 6 will be hosting a tea party** in the hall raising money for Macmillan Nurses. Past pupils, staff and governors will be visiting from 2-4 pm and will have guided tours and will see our display of old school documents and photos. We hope they will be able to share memories that we intend to record in some form. I hope that there will be a joyful reunion of friends.

I intend for us to have a centenary service of thanks-giving in **April**, **2013** to coincide with the actual opening of the building in April 1913. September 1912 was the centenary of the laying of the foundation stone by Lady Alice Ewing.

The centenary week will finish with a **disco party** for the children organised by the SPSA. A separate letter has already been sent out with details. Further details can be found towards the end of the newsletter.

Staff news - Mr Thomas is currently unwell and his class has a supply teacher. Home-learning could be affected if he is off for the rest of the week.

The school library over the holiday has been refurbished and restocked. Please have a look inside to see the improvements. Mrs Richards has made a splendid job of the soft furnishings making it a very attractive environment.
