Collective Worship

Dear Parent/ Carer,

Thank you for the tins and packets of food sent in for the Community Larder last Thursday. This week in collective worship we are thinking about Harvest-time and the concept about how in the past communities shared the harvest. The week will culminate with Harvest Festival at St Peter's Church at 10am on Sunday morning. As is the custom at this school, we shall ask each family to provide a Harvest gift. This year we shall ask you to send in a tin or packet for the Community Larder as the gift. These can be sent into school on Thursday. We shall send the gifts to church for a blessing at the Sunday service before they go to the Community Larder. The children are preparing a Harvest song to sing at the Festival and it would be very much appreciated if there could be good support from the families with their attendance. It is particularly pertinent that the Harvest Festival coincides with Budleigh's Food Festival week-end.

Punctuality

Please ensure that you are in the playground before the whistle is blown. It is important that we make a prompt start to the school day and that the time for teaching and learning is maximised. I politely request that parents leave the children as quickly as possible when the whistle is blown as this will help us achieve our objective.

Early Morning Arrangements

session was followed by a special acting class for Year 4 where he demonstrated his talents to our


