Dear Parents/ Carers

Last week we had an excellent turn out for **Parent Forum** with four new parents who came to give it a try. Mr Lee shared with the forum ideas for **improving sports day** and the ensuing discussion has helped us to refine activities. We hope you will enjoy the new format on **Thursday 23rd May** when we intend to run the event. Please put the date in your diary now. Miss Hume also shared ideas about the **remodelling of the environmental area** to the rear of the swimming pool. Governors last night agreed to support plans to fill in the pond and install an outside learning area that can be used more creatively and safely for learning. We now need to think how we might raise the £10K to support the project. Parents came up with lots of ideas for raising funds and the **SPSA** will kindly give a substantial amount to move the project forward. A

copy of the outline plan can be seen on the notice-board in the playground. **Our next meeting will be at 7pm on Thursday 7th May.**

### Governor News

Parents will be interested to learn that Governors will soon meet with the Diocese about the **possible development of new classrooms** on the newly acquired land where the Drill Hall stood. I cannot report any details as yet but there is a desire to do some work within the next financial year. So watch this space for further announcements. Governors are delighted to see that **school meal numbers** have much improved although there was some concern that we seem to fall short of our target of at least 100 meals consumed each day. **At £2 a meal, we are offering a very competitive price** and would like to see the uptake of meals increase so that we can at least keep the price stable and break even so that money intended for teaching and learning is not supporting the meals service. I should be very grateful if parents might reconsider their arrangements and give school dinners a try.

We are making slow but steady progress **with improving the boundary security**. Our new fences are due to be installed before the summer term at a cost of £20K. This sum of money is paid from the capital funds which are separate to our school budget. Finally, the Governors decided on the school **term dates for September 2013 until July 2014**. These are now available on the web-site.

**Headteacher awards** this month show a significant increase because there has been a review of home-learning of every child from Y2 - Y6 and awards have been given where there is significant progress and when there was consistent evidence of high effort over the Autumn term.

**Please help us to keep the children safe.**

\* Please do not **put soiled disposable nappies** in any of the school bins but take them home with you. We find we are in breach of our contracts for waste when this happens. Furthermore it could cause a hygiene risk.

\* **Parking at the beginning and end of the day**. Cones are now being used at road entrances to keep parking away from the school crossing patrol. The patrol needs clear visibility, Mr Williams needs to be seen and he needs to see pedestrians on the pavement to ensure those on foot are safe from harm.

The focus of the 90 minute E-safety session is on:

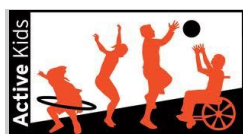
- An overview of the risks and benefits of technology.
