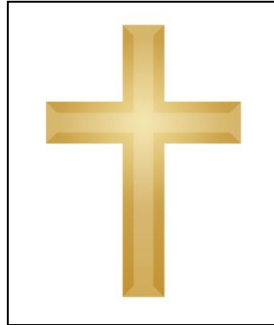

Dear Parents/Carers,

The children behaved beautifully at the event when waiting in the dressing room for our slot at the end of the first act. Everyone enjoyed the children's singing - so a huge well done to all the children that represented our school and also to Mr Perkins, Miss Salter and Mrs Lewis for leading the group from St. Peter's.

Tomorrow (7th March) it is World Book Day and we look forward to seeing the children dressed up as a character from a children's book for a voluntary contribution of 50p or alternatively if they prefer just wearing one item to symbolise their favourite book character or they can bring in their favourite book to share with their class. Any funds raised will go towards new books for our school library. There will be a number of reading related activities taking place during the day for the children, so I am sure the day will be thoroughly enjoyable.

Tomorrow evening (Thursday 7th March) from 5.30-7pm we are holding an E-Safety parents' session. In this constantly changing world of Information Technology, we all need to feel informed about the potential risks of this technology and of ways that we can support our children to adopt safe practices. The session is run by the South West Grid for Learning and is free to attend. We hope that you will be able to join us.

IMPORTANT- Acceptable Use of ICT Pupil Agreement. We have recently agreed our new E-Safety policy (thank you to all those parents that contributed to this) and have now put together an acceptable use of ICT pupil agreement. We would be really grateful if you could read through the agreement with your child so that they are aware of the rules regarding use of ICT in school and then if your child is in KS2 we would be grateful if both you and your child could sign it and then return it to school. If your child is in FSU/KS1 then we would like you to sign on behalf of your child to indicate that you have read it with them and that your child agrees to abide by the rules. Please can we have all signed pupil agreements back by **Friday 15th March.**

Head lice

We have recently reviewed our head lice procedure to ensure that it follows the latest guidance. If your child is found to have headlice then you must treat your child for head lice on the same day. The school will inform you that we have found headlice in your child's hair.

Every parent should check their child's hair once a week for head lice using the wet combing method and if they find lice they should treat it every three days for 2 weeks.

Follow the steps below for wet detection combing:

- Wash hair using ordinary shampoo and apply plenty of conditioner. Use a wide-toothed comb to straighten and untangle the hair.
- Once the comb moves freely through the hair without dragging, switch to the louse detection comb. Make sure the teeth of the comb slot into the hair at the roots with the bevel-edge of the teeth lightly touching the scalp.
- Draw the comb down to the ends of the hair with every stroke, and check the comb for lice.
- Remove lice by wiping or rinsing the comb.
- Work methodically through the hair, section by section, so that the whole head of hair is combed through.
- Rinse out the conditioner and repeat the combing procedure in the wet hair.

Checking the rest of the family.

If you discover head lice in your child's hair, you should check the rest of the family, alert close friends and inform the school.

Treatment should only be carried out after live head lice have been found. Do not treat hair 'just in case'. But once confirmed take immediate steps to treat head lice.

Children must not go on the monkey bars before the start of the school day. Please can you ensure that your child does not go on them at this time. This is because we are unable to supervise them adequately. Children are allowed on the monkey bars at breaktimes (on the day that their teacher is on duty) so do have an opportunity to go on them during the week. Thank you for your co-operation in this matter.

Hair

Please can you make that if your child has shoulder length hair or longer that it is tied back for school each day.
