Dear Parent/ Carer,

I should like to start this newsletter with congratulations to Mrs Kate Harrison, Chair of the SPSA on a very **successful school fayre**. £2400 approximately was taken and the help from many parents who ran stalls was very impressive. I thank everyone for their support and enthusiasm. We look forward now to planning how we shall spend further money to enhance and enrich the children's education at St Peter's. I look forward to seeing everyone tomorrow at the **Open Evening held between 4 – 6pm.** This is an opportunity for parents to talk to their child's class teacher following

receipt of the end of year report summary regarding attainment levels and progress. It is also an opportunity for you to meet your child's next teacher. Miss Back, our new member of staff will be in the hall for parents to meet with her. On a display in the hall, is the initial outline plan for the proposed science and outdoor learning area which, should we be successful with our bid for funds, will begin and be completed in the coming academic year.

Please note tomorrow is also our French Day starting with breakfast at 8.30 am.

I have pleasure in sharing with you **the initial end of year assessments for Year 2 and 6** which will be validated in the Autumn. We are still awaiting at Year 6 the overall levels for English which is the combined marks for reading and writing. I am pleased with the much improved results the school has made in writing at both key stages which now is in line with the already high reading and maths attainment. Standards when compared to last year's National and Devon bench marks continue to be significantly much higher. Particularly pleasing, are the high levels achieved in reading that exceeds the national expectation at both key stages. There are also many more Level 5s in Maths and Writing at Year 6, which shows much improvment on previous years.

The Level 4 range is the national expectation of the year group. Level 5 exceeds national expectations for the year group. Level 6 significantly exceeds national expectation. Rows of percentages may not total 100% due to rounding up and down of decimal points.

Swimming time. At St Peter's we are very fortunate to have frequent and regular swimming sessions with a qualified instructor. Warm Wish and Jane Hushon are to be commended for their continuing raising of money to improve the swimming pool and related facilities. Jane has done some marvellous fund-raising over the years to subsidise payment for the instructors. In the long term this is not sustainable and having raised this concern at Parent Forum we have decided that the best way forward is to ask families to make a swimming fund contribution towards costs. I recognise that if you have three children or more at the school we may need to adjust the contribution we are asking you to pay from Spring 2014. This is under consultation. In the meantime, I am asking each family to contribute £7 from September for the swimming period September through to October 2013.

Summer Fete

I would like to thank all the children who participated in the range of performances we had at the Summer Fete on Saturday. It certainly added a lot to the occasion. I also thank Mr Moger-Taylor and Miss Salter for giving up their time to help me with it all. It was a great showcase for music at the school. It was particularly great to have the Community Choir singing - We are ever hopeful of new members. You can join us on Monday to see what it's like at 4:45 in the hall and then we will continue next year. It was also great to have the string group perform Liam Whiteman's own composition and to show off the Beatboards that the SPSA kindly purchased for the school.
