

Dear Parents and Carers,

Another busy academic year has nearly finished and this will be the last newsletter until September. It is to be hoped that the sunshine will continue for the coming weeks and I wish you all a very happy summer break. Many thanks too for your continuing support and encouragement.

The following events are still to happen

- * Monday 22nd July 10.45am 12noon. Children visit their new classrooms and meet the teacher for September.
- * Tuesday 23rd July at 10.00 am in the Church **The Y6 Leaver's Service and presentations followed by the Leaving Barbecue in the afternoon.**

Every child should have returned their **school library books by today**. Please check with your child that this is the case.

As you may be aware, there was concern last week expressed by Michael Gove, Secretary of State for Education about the contents of Packed Lunch Boxes as many are unhealthy and contain items that have far too much saturated fats and salt. Evidence at this school would support his findings, too many packed lunched contain crisps and chocolate bars. These items are not permitted at St Peter's. I shall be taking a firm line in September to ban these items. The school dinner menu is nutritionally sound and meals are balanced, it is a sensible alternative. Please consider having them. Many parents tell us that children frequently try different foods at school and develop a broader tastes.

Good progress with running our own kitchen has been made over the year and I congratulate Mrs Smith and Mrs MacDonald for their hard work to ensure that meals are of a high standard and that many more children have a hot lunch. In April 2012, we reported that the school was faced with subsidising catering costs by £17K+, after the first year this has been reduced to £6K+. A wonderful achievement. However, the school should not be subsiding meals at all as it takes away valuable funds to support your child's learning. At the moment, our charge of £2 a meal is very favourable when compared with many schools who have been charging £2.10. It is with some regret that our meals will need to be priced from September at £2.05. If everyone put their money spent on packed lunches into the school dinners, standards and quality of meals would be even better.

Due to recent changes made by the Department for Education, the criteria for additional holidays to be taken in term time have been tightened and will operate from September 2013. Authorisation of additional holiday time will only be permitted in exceptional circumstances, it is for parents to provide the evidence as to the nature of the exceptional circumstance and communicate this clearly to the Headteacher. Parents who, for work reasons, cannot take a holiday in the school holiday period will need to prove why this is the case. Financial reasons are not considered an exceptional circumstance. Additional holidays which are not authorised will automatically result in a penalty notice of £60. This is all explained on the form S2 Absence request form which is available on the school's web site under the heading Parent Zone http://www.st-peters-school.org.uk/ or available in the school reception area.

Message to Year 6 Parents

Exmouth Community College strongly advise parents to provide gum shields for all hockey and rugby lessons. Other secondary schools also require pupils to have gum shields.
