

Dear Parent/ Carer,



I hope you had a very good half term with the children and that everyone is now geared for the haul up to Christmas. As you know, the Year 6 children are in London this week and you can follow their progress on the school twitter account which can be accessed on the school website. Yesterday, they visited the Science and Natural Science Museum and saw fireworks over the River Thames. They are staying near St Paul's Cathedral and it is true that the bells are rung at 6.30am.

This Sunday is family service at Church at 10 am and also the act of remembrance at the war memorial at 1.45pm when I shall be laying a wreath on behalf of the school. It would be very encouraging if families might attend one of the events or both if they can. Our school was at its infancy when the First World War began in 1914 but during the Second World War (1939-1945) many past pupils joined up to serve their country, also the school was host to many evacuees and was central to relief efforts when Exeter was bombed

becoming a an emergency housing centre for displaced families who had lost their homes in the Exeter blitz. Poppies can still be purchased at school this week.

Monday 11th November being Armistice Day we shall be holding the silence of remembrance at 11am. It is also our 1940 day with the school dinner being cooked from a recipe of the time. As previously mentioned, the Year 6 children will be interviewing some older residents of Budleigh for the Budleigh Book of Memories. The school is working in partnership with Homestead to ensure that valuable personal history is not lost with the passage of time. We are expecting between 20 -24 guests for the 1940 special dinner . Also the Year 6 classroom will become a 1940 museum for the week.

I look forward to seeing you at the following November events that are recently coming up:-Monday 18th November - Parent Forum - 7pm to 8.30pm - all welcome. Thursday 21st November - 3.30pm Messy church followed by meal and lantern procession through the town to celebrate St. Martin's Day. Friday 29th November - early evening - School Christmas Fayre organised by the excellent SPSA committee and helpers. if you would like to help then let Mrs Nadine Ebsworth know.

We shall be continuing our weekly collection for the Exmouth/ Budleigh larder. The collection box on fine days will be near the sandwich trolleys by the hall or if wet inside in the hall by the trolleys. Thank you for your generous support.

Due to the generosity of the Browing family, the school has been presented with a life saving defibrillator in memory of Mr Browing. This is a very expensive piece of equipment and gives our school community a special resource to be used in emergencies that could save lives. Certain members of staff will receive training on using the defibrillator. Year 4 have been the class chosen to have special teaching about the defibrillator.

Cross Country

On Thursday 24th November, forty pupils from Key Stage 2 represented St Peter's Church of England Primary School in the Exmouth Cross Country Competition at Bicton College. For many pupils, this was their first experience of an inter-school cross country competition. The standard of competition was very high, but there were several performances of note including Esme Kilburn-Thompson, Lauren May, Amy May, Carly Cox, Sonny Cox and Jack Garner.

The event also included a Year 3/4 Boys and Year 3/4 Girls qualification event for the East Devon Cross Country Finals. I am very pleased to announce that our Year 3/4 Boys team and our Year 3/4 Girls team qualified having both secured 1st place in their categories. The six fastest Year 3/4 Boy runners (Sonny Cox, Jack Garner, George Moger-Taylor, Jake Howarth, Robin Squire and Fin Cotton) and the six fastest Year 3/4 Girl runners (Amy May, Carly Cox, Grace Gillingham, Hattie Real, Yasmin Levi and Bethany Browring) will represent St Peter's at the East Devon Finals on Thursday 7th November.

Unfortunately, due to an unexpectedly high number of participants, the organisers ran

out of certificates for certain age groups. Please see me if you did not receive a certificate and I will arrange for one to be presented in school.

The overall standings are as follows: Blue 178; Green 224; Yellow 243 and Red (Leading) 253.
