It was good to see the **Year 6 return from London** last Thursday safe and sound having had a marvellous time. The children saw the significant landmarks and reports indicate that they had a fun time but learnt a great deal. The leaders were **delighted with the positive behaviour and attitudes of the children** who were a great credit to their

school and to their families. There were many comments from the public, coach driver, museum staff and hostel managers about the very good, responsible, polite behaviour of the children which is very encouraging.

There was a good support from families for both the Family Service of Remembrance and the wreath laying last Sunday which was very encouraging. Thank you for your support. This was followed up at school on Monday when we held a school two minute silence and we shall continue the theme of remembrance during our acts of worship this week. It was a great opportunity for the children to listen and record the memories of people living in the war years, they learnt a great deal and the experience made history come alive. I was impressed with how well the children responded to the challenge of simple journalism and also to see them welcome our guests from the community to the school. 
